Competition details:

We're seeking raw songwriting talent so there's no need to enter professional recordings. Songs will only be judged on their originality, lyrics, melody, composition, and potential to be a smash hit! However, a good recording can most certainly help to enhance the impact of your song (see the Song Academy blog posts on recording tips).

This competition will be separately judged for 8-12 year olds and 13-18 year olds and a separate category for international entries. Each entrant may enter up to 5 songs and an additional 5 joint entries. The deadline to enter the competition is 2nd April 2017. The entry fee is £5 per song to cover administration costs.
